

United ISD Uses Sirius Education Solutions to get 65% of Students to Mastery Level on the Algebra I STAAR Exam

Ramiro Garza became the United ISD High School Math Coordinator in January of 2014, at a time when the districtwide passing rate for the STAAR Algebra I assessment was 65%.

Soon after, due to a change in the TEKS, the district looked for a new program and began using the Sirius Algebra I EOC STAAR Preparation and Practice workbook. The choice, as Garza says, was clear. "Sirius was a better product than the other workbooks, and ultimately it turned a focus on rigor, style, and format."

Results came quickly. By 2017, the overall passing rate districtwide increased to 91%. All populations rose. Even those considered "at risk" had a passing rate of over 80% in 2017. While this is an outstanding achievement, Garza knew that there was so much more to accomplish.

"Once you get to the 70% level everyone relaxes a bit and starts to feel good. At the time we were in the 80's level so I put out a new challenge, and that was for the Level 3's, or Mastery level.




About 2 years ago I noticed that we were starting to have gains at mastery level. That was a happy surprise. Those were the more rigorous questions and I'm happy that a great number of our high school students are doing so well."

By Spring 2019, an amazing 65% of United ISD students taking the Algebra I EOC assessment attained the Mastery level. That's 26 points higher than the statewide average. In fact, United ISD students taking the Algebra I exam perform significantly over the state average in every category, including those students considered At-Risk.

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
United ISD Districtwide vs. Texas state average, Spring 2019
